<p><u>Pupils’ Behaviour in School</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What do we think of the behaviour of children in our school? • What do we think is good about behaviour in school? • What do we think we need to improve in terms of behaviour in school? • Are there any changes which we need to make to improve behaviour across school? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On the whole behaviour across school is very good. • Behaviour for ‘OPAL’ at lunch times is very good and has improved behaviour outside • Behaviour in classes is usually very good. • Children understand behaviour traffic lights mainly, but there is a lot of writing on each of the colours. • We could have pictures on the traffic lights for the youngest children who can’t read. • Sometimes people talk when the teacher is talking – this makes it hard to concentrate. • Mr Corbishley has a class charter – this may be useful for some of the other classes. • At the end of the day, we could have a behaviour debrief with a particular focus – Eg) Today you have worked well on communication etc. • We think there should be a ‘no playing with sticks’ rule outside as this sometimes leads to children being hurt. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RA to discuss these suggestions with Senior Leaders and action manageable ideas.
