 Feedback and Marking What do the school council think is helpful when the teachers give feedback on their work? What do the school council think that younger and older children should have for marking and feedback? What is helpful for the different ages of pupils? 	 Children feel that verbal feedback is more useful than written feedback Red amber green on title is easy for all of the children to understand (but some teachers don't do this all the time) The children agreed that they do like to see that the teacher has written something in their books sometimes so that they know that the teacher has looked at their work Children don't like it when there is too much writing from teachers in their books – they find this too difficult to understand Teachers should continue mark in blue and not red as the children think that red is a 'bad' colour Children think they need to go back and look at their work more after it has been marked so that they can get the time to make it better One good thing and one area for development identified on work might be useful sometimes 	 RA to ensure that all of these suggestions are reflected on the changes to the feedback and marking policy which are due to take place in a staff meeting on 17.01.24.
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
