In this unit pupils	• how people's behaviour affects themselves and others, including online		
learn:	• how to model being polite and courteous in different situations and recognise the respectful behaviour they show receive in return		
	• about the relationship between rights and responsibilities		
	 about the right to privacy and how to recognise when a confidence or secret should be kept (such as a nice birthday surprise everyone will find out about) or not agreed to and when to tell (e.g. if someone is being upset or hurt) the rights that children have and why it is important to protect these 		
	• that everyone should feel included, respected and not discriminated against; how to respond if they witness or experience exclusion, disrespect or discrimination		
	• how to respond to aggressive or inappropriate behaviour (including online and unwanted physical contact) — how to report concerns
