Listen to our families and respond to questions and concerns as quickly as we can.

Inform school by 9:15am if my child is going to be absent to let us know the reason for this. Encourage my child to work hard and try their best both at school and at home. Support my child at home with reading and other home learning tasks. Support staff in school to implement our 'Restorative Approach to Positive Behaviour'. Attend family consultation evenings to discuss my child, making us aware of any circumstances which may impact their wellbeing. Read and reply to any school correspondence as required. Support the PTA in whichever ways that I can. Not share private emails which are sent to me from school with other members of the school community. Always treat school staff and other members of the school community with respect, politeness and in a calm manner - I will ensure that I refrain from raising my voice or being	 Always try to do my best and help others to do the same. Work hard and listen carefully. Be an enthusiastic, kind and thoughtful member of our school family. Be honest and tell the truth, even when things go wrong. Share my ideas, opinions and achievements with others and celebrate these together. Ask someone for help if my work is too hard or I do not understand the task. Use the 'traffic light' system in school to help me to make positive choices. Be 'ready', 'respectful' and 'safe' and follow the rules in our 'Restorative Approach to Positive Behaviour'. Tell a member of school staff if I am feeling unhappy or worried about something. Read every day and do any homework tasks set by my teacher. Talk about what I do at school with my family at home. Be responsible for our school and environment, taking care of resources.
